

My Story, by Dave Wenzlick

I've always had affection for Chevrolet Corvairs, especially the 1965-69 models. My grandmother drove a 1965 Corvair Corsa 140 Coupe which I eventually owned and restored. They were very unique compared to anything else offered by the Big 3. So beautifully styled then and still looking good today. No matter where I drive a Corvair they always attract attention. I can park next to classic Corvettes and Camaros at car shows but my Corvair usually receives all of the attention. I love it!

I owned 13 Corvairs while I lived in Indianapolis. In the early 80's every car we owned was a Corvair including the main family car which was a 62 Monza wagon with a gas heater. After the wagon was too rusty to pass the state inspection we drove a 66 4-dr. My grandmother's restored 65 Corsa Coupe won first place at the World of Wheels Car Show in Indianapolis in winter of 1983. Other notable Corvairs I owned while I lived in Indy was a beat up 65 Monza coupe that was rescued after being fully submerged in a lake for several days. I also owned a 65 Monza convertible with a 327 Crown V8 conversion and a 69 Monza coupe that had a Kelmark Chevy 350 conversion as well as being chopped and widened extensively. Before I moved to Phoenix I sold all my Corvairs except for my grandmother's Corsa.

A couple of years after the move to Phoenix and after 18 years of marriage I found myself divorced and raising two kids. Needing money I sold my grandmother's Corsa to a buyer in Prescott and I have not seen it since. I told myself someday I would find another.

A few years ago I saw an all original, non-operating, 66 Corsa 140 Coupe on Craig's List over in Glendale and I picked it up and slowly rebuilt the engine and front suspension. I drive it occasionally and work on it as time permits.

After that purchase I have found four other Corvairs including a 64 Monza coupe, a 65 Corsa Coupe Toronado V8 conversion, a 66 Corsa Coupe Toronado V8 conversion plus a 65 Monza parts car (factory A/C).

I just moved into a new place a month ago and will have some more room to work and keep all of my Corvairs in one location. The Corvair I've work on the most lately is the 66 V8. It was running when bought but towed home from Albuquerque in sad shape with serious cracks in the suspension components. I completely rebuilt the rear suspension and installed a larger engine while I was at it. It now has a big block 455 from a 73 Toronado with a 66 Toronado tranny and differential. The tranny is a 3-speed automatic and it has a rare switch-pitch torque converter that changes the stall speed of the torque converter electronically.

At some point in the future I want to drop a modern turbocharged 4-cyl FWD power plant into the back of a LM Corvair, similar to my Toronado conversions but that will have to wait for another day. As always...too many projects.
