What's My Car Worth?

Recently at the Barrett-Jackson Collector Car Auction in Las Vegas, this 1965 Corvair Monza 110hp, Powerglide with 54,000 original miles sold for a whopping \$25,300 (including auction fees). According to the description, this is a garage-kept Oregon car having been through a complete nut-and-bolt restoration. The engine and transmission have been completely resealed, and the interior is a blend of factory original and new. The body was sealed with PPG DP Epoxy primer and painted with DBC General Motors Victory Red base coat and PPG 2002 clear. According to the seller, the original trim has been straightened and polished. Custom modifications include a lowered stance



with staggered rims and tires, front Camaro chin spoiler, custom dual exhaust, custom sound system featuring stocklooking radio, Italian air horns and a LeMans-style racing fuel cap.



On the other hand, this 1964 Convertible Monza, Powerglide, sold for only \$8250. This nearly original early model shows with an AM radio, bucket seats and optional full wheel spoke covers, new Monza chrome rocker and wheel openings moldings for 1964.



Corvair prices are on the rise; but as the Barrett-Jackson auction shows, they remain all over the place. According to Haggerty Insurance Valuation data, a 1964 Convertible Monza Powerglide in the auction advertised condition comes in conservatively between \$7,000 and \$12,000 (Fair to Good condition). The 1965 Monza advertised, considering the modifications, should fall in the same price range. Public auctions are a relatively small percentage of

collector car transactions (less than 20%, in fact); yet, their visibility provides a great opportunity to consider vehicle values. Haggerty valuation metrics considers both small- and large-scale activity, on-site vehicle inspections and third party data from auctions. Additionally, they factor in dealer sales (approximately 12% of

transactions), and peer-to-peer sales that constitute the overwhelming majority of the collector car marketplace (71.5%, to be exact) where transactional data can be aggregated from a vast network of insured clients. About Us:

While a salesman at Rudolph Chevrolet in Phoenix Arizona, Lou Grubb decided there were possibilities in an inexpensive, economy car produced by the Chevrolet Division, the Corvair. He sent letters to recent Corvair buyers and devotees alike inviting them to a social dedicated to appreciation of the car. With a promising response, discussion turned to organizing a new sports car club. With hasty planning, the first event was an economy run put together by a group of rookie enthusiasts who later became the first members of Cactus Corvair Club after its Constitution was signed in October 2, 1963. We are the oldest, continually active, Corvair club in the world!

As part of the Phoenix Chapter of CORSA (Corvair Society of America) we hosted our first regional miniconvention in April of 1976. People from all over the country came, with an estimated 90 cars and 150 people attendees. The event included autocross, a concours show, driving tour of the Valley of the Sun, and a "Fiesta banquet.

The Cactus Corvair Club hosts an annual All-Corvair show in early October, participates in classic car shows throughout the year (usually benefitting local charities), and supports classic car events, museums, and organizations dedicated to the preservation and public education of our automotive history. We are a community of car enthusiasts; all our events are family oriented and we are excited to meet you.
