My First Corvair -Part One by Larry Starr

It's June, 1966, and brings the arrival of our new, shiny, Danube Blue, Corvair Monza, with all synchromesh 4speed transmission, 3.55 rear end, and pushbutton AM Radio. Unfortunately, I was not in attendance at that happy event, being ensconced in Navy Boot camp in San Diego. In those days, if you lost your college deferment, you got a draft notice. I beat the draft by signing up with the navy on the 120 day delay program along with their offer of E-3 out of boot camp for having a Community College degree.

In 1962, my brother-in-law and sister bought a brand new Corvair Monza Convertible, black with teal interior and white top. Lee was a local truck driver and avid race car enthusiast. He had test driven the Studebaker Avanti Turbo before choosing the Corvair. In addition to 4-spd and 3.55 rear end, he'd also gotten the heavy duty suspension with rebound straps and sintered brakes. That little car went great and he just drove the hell out of it. Today, it sits under a cover in his garage, not having been driven in the last 29 years, but he won't sell it to me or restore it himself. Maybe I'll inherit it someday. Anyway, I was sold on Corvairs and had to have one when I could afford it.

Prior to going in the Navy, my new wife and I decided we'd be traveling a lot in the navy, so we peddled our Smokey Ford Falcon and ordered a new Corvair. It cost \$2560. We put down \$1060 and financed the \$1500 with GMAC at \$60 per month. Not a great amount, but as a Seaman, I would be making \$180 a month.

Since we ordered exactly what we wanted, it took time to come and so was delivered after I was in the Navy. It was the only thing of value we owned at that time.

Upon returning from Boot camp, I had orders to Treasure Island, CA to attend 20 weeks of Electronic School. We packed up our gear, with Lee's help for this adventurous trip to California. For those of you who have never packed all your belongings in a Corvair, there's a trick to it. First, bring out everything you are taking so the packer can see it all. Never put anything in a box that goes in the front. There are lots of nooks and crannies up there that you can stuff a lot of things in. Must box items go on the fold-down rear seat. Also included are a spare fan belt and the tools to change a belt. Off we went, with \$300 cash between us and knowing that if Peggy didn't find a job, we'd lose the Car. No problem. Didn't see why both sets of parents were worried.

Lee gave me one important piece of advice about driving a Corvair. He told me "It's air cooled and to provide cooling the fan needs to be turning up pretty good. Keep your RPM's up all the time and don't lug it in 4th gear". I still follow this rule today, never running below 2000 RPM unless in 1st gear. It has served me well all through the years. Our little car ran great and we buzzed down Interstate 5 to the Bay Area at the legal limit of 70 MPH. We both drove and were thrilled at how well it handled in curvy parts. As advertised, it was a "Poor Man's Porsche".
