My Six-Year Project

In 2009 I purchased this 1965 Corsa convertible. It was painted in a light blue with metallic blue interior. At some time in the past, a second set of taillights had been installed to make it look an Impala.

The motor was a 110 out of a Monza but it did come with the original engine which had been taken out because it had a knock problem. A rebuild 140 engine out of a Monza came with the car, which Tom Martin had planned on putting into the car. I put that rebuilt engine into my 1963 Monza to replace the engine which had done nothing but cause me problems. I rebuilt the original 140 engine and placed it back in the Corsa. When the engine was apart we found that the cam shaft gear had a tooth missing.

The car still has the original transmission and posi-traction differential. Besides rebuilding the engine, the suspension, brakes and steering were also rebuilt before being sent to the body shop where the car spent almost 4 years. I must say the results were less than I had expected. They replaced the front floor pans, rocker panels, bottom 9 inches of the fenders and patched the wheel wells. It seems that the mid-60's GM cars liked to hold water in the rockers and bottom of the fenders. The rust damage was not from salt, this car rusted from the inside out.

John opened the meeting at 7:09 P.M.


Motion to accept the Treasure's report at read was given by Dave W., Larry seconded it and the motion was passed.


