The Board met on Feb. 26 to start reviewing the bylaws and working through the necessary changes. Please review the first sections of the bylaw changes below. Determine if there are any changes that you feel should be added and/or deleted to the bylaws and bring those recommendations to the next meeting on April 6<sup>th</sup>. The below was reviewed and accepted as the guidelines during the meeting on April 6<sup>th</sup>. Spelling will be double checked before sending to the lawyer on completion since it was indicated that there maybe some spelling errors.

#### **Article I- Offices and Corporate Seal**

**1. Principal Office-** In addition to its known place of business, which shall be the office of its statutory agent, the corporation shall maintain a principal office in Maricopa County, AZ.

**2. Other Offices-** The corporation may also maintain offices at such other place or places, either within or without the State of Arizona, as may be designated from time to time by the board of directors, and the business of the corporation may be transacted at such other offices with the same effect as that conduct at the principal office.

**3. Coporate Seal-** A coporate seal shall not be requisite to the validity of any instrument executed by or on behalf of the coporation, but nevertheless if in any instance the corporation seal be used, the same shall be, at the pleasure of the officer affixing the same, a circle having on the circumference thereof CACTUS CORVAIR CLUB, INC., and in the center "Incorporated 1978".

#### **Article II- Membership**

**1. General-** membership in the club shall be granted to those in agreement with its objectives. Ownership of the marquee cars are encouraged, but is not, however, a condition for membership. There shall be no provision made restricting membership due to race, creed, color, sex or age. Any person can be a guest at Cactus Corvair Club meetings three times only- at which time the person will be required to either join Cactus Corvair Club or is is denied membership will not be permitted at any business meeting and all future events sponsored by Cactus Corvair Club.

2. Classification- Single membership shall be limited to that person of legal age interested in the aims and purposes of the Club. He shall have full membership privileges the chapter level including voting and holding office. Family: a family membership shall be limited to those persons of legal age interested in the aims and purposes of the Club. They shall have full membership privileges on the chapter level including voting and holding offices. This membership shall also include minor children until age 18. These minors shall have full membership privileges on the chapter level, excluding voting and holding office. Honorary: an honorary member is a person upon which the board of directors confers complimentary membership for outstanding service to the Club. Honorary members shall not vote or hold office. They shall not be required to pay dues.

3. Charter Members: Charter members of the CACTUS CORVAIR CLUB, INC., shall be those individuals on the membership rolls as of the time the articles of incorporation are filed, however, charter members of the CACTUS CORVAIRE CLUB are those whose membership dues were paid as of Dec. 4, 1963.

4. Applications: Membership application shall be required of all applicants and must receive approval by two-thirds vote of the board of directors. For final approval or disapproval.

5. Votes: Membership listed on the Club books as paid and bearing current membership cards are entitled to vote as follows: Single- one vote, Family - two votes, Honorary- no vote.

6. Address: It shall be the responsibility of each member to notify the Treasurer or member of the board of any address or telephone changes.
